Peters repeats as top player

Cathedral High School senior pitcher Dillon Peters is The Indianapolis Star's Super Team Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. Peters was 10-2 with a 1.41 ERA and struck out 155 in 792/3 innings to help Cathedral (28-3) finish as the state runner-up in Class 4A.

He also played outfield and hit in the middle of the order, batting .353 with 13 doubles, two triples, one home run, 29 runs batted in and 24 runs scored. Peters, who has signed with the University of Texas, was taken in the 20th round of the major league draft by the Cleveland Indians.

Have you had much contact with the Cleveland Indians: "No, I haven't. When they drafted me, I knew it was going to be a draft-and-follow situation. The later the offer is, the better. It's supposed to be late in the summer after they've seen me a bunch. I won't know until August. I'm very open. I want to be in Major League Baseball as quick as possible and whichever way is quicker, I'm going to decide at the end of the summer."

Most embarrassing moment on the field: "I rounded first during a high school

game with Cathedral and I tripped and fell."
